### Research Interests

My area of interest is adult neurogenic communication disorders. Throughout my career, I have pursued opportunities focused on rehabilitation service delivery for adults with speech-language and cognitive-communication disorders, specifically traumatic brain injury, and right hemisphere impairment. My previous work experience managing an interdisciplinary day neuro rehabilitation program and practicing speech-language pathology in the medical setting across the continuum of care were the contributing factors to concentrating on this population. As a Professor of Practice, I have developed and expanded multiple clinical programs. Each program is specifically designed for preparing future clinicians to deliver best-practice speech-language services for adults with neurogenic communication disorders. I have collaborated with a nationally renowned rehabilitation facility to create an on-site medical experience for UT Dallas graduate students. The development of this program met an additional area of interest to advance student training and clinical competency for a career in medical speech-language pathology. A supplementary goal achieved during this collaboration was mentoring and training experienced speech-language pathologists to excel as clinical instructors.
